Revelation 20b The Nations Left

Last week during our study into the 20th chapter of the book of Revelation, we took a close look at exactly who the Angel was that came down from Heaven holding in his hand the key to the bottomless pit and a great chain. And we also spoke briefly about how this Angel seized the Dragon (also known as the devil and Satan), and bound him for 1000 years.


In today's study we're going to take a closer look at why the Dragon was bound for 1000 years, and why it is that the devil was once again cut loose after the thousand-year millennial reign comes to its conclusion.

Last week we also looked at who it was that was seated on the thrones and had been given the authority to judge versus those who had been beheaded for their testimony of our Messiah and for the word of his Father. These are those of us who will have stood firm in the last days, and who did not deny our Messiah, and who were found keeping his laws and his commandments. And once again I want us to remember exactly who it was that this Dragon was making war with during the end of the age. **Once again Revelation chapter 12 verse 17 (scrn 1)**

Rev 12:17 Then the dragon became furious with the woman and went off to make war on the rest of her offspring, on those who keep the commandments of God and hold to the testimony of Jesus. And he stood on the sand of the sea.



It is those who are keeping the commandments of Yah, and holding to the testimony of his Son Yeshua that the devil is making war with here in Revelation chapter 12. If you are not keeping the commandments of the Father, and holding to the testimony of his Son, then the devil is not making war with you because he already has you. It will be those souls who have been beheaded for the testimony of Yeshua and for the word of his Father, and those who had not worshiped the beast or its image, and had not received its Mark on their four heads or on their hands that the devil will be making war with. It will be those who were busy keeping the commandments of Yah, and the true gospel message of his only begotten Son that will be ruling and reigning with our Messiah for 1000 years. And I want us to remember that not all of us will actually die. There will be some left who will still be alive on the earth when our Messiah comes. **First Thessalonians chapter 4 verses 13 through 17 (scrn 2)**



And so, I want us to understand these different groups of people, and who they are, and what role we all play in our Messiahs 1000-year millennial kingdom. **E1**

Here in Revelation chapter 20 verse four, the actual breakdown of who will be left, who will be raised from the dead, who will reign over the nations, and who the nations will be is made clear.

The first thing that we see in Revelation chapter 20 verse four, are the 12 apostles who will sit on the 12 thrones judging the 12 tribes of Israel (and we took a look at that last week). We then see all of the people who were martyred for the testimony of our Messiah and for the word of Yah who did not take the Mark of the beast and stood strong, and were found worthy. Those who did not stand for the testimony of our Messiah, and those who were led into taking the

Mark of the beast, would not be resurrected until after the thousand-year millennial reign has ended.

And so, I want to be very clear here; there are indeed two resurrections. The first resurrection is for those souls who had been martyred for the testimony of our Messiah and for the word of his Father, and those of us who had not worshiped the beast, or received its Mark. This is the first resurrection, and this is exactly who it is that will rule and reign with our Messiah for 1000 years. And so, the question then becomes, “*who are we going to reign over?*”, And we’ll get to that in just a moment. But before we do, I want us to understand what is written in Revelation chapter 20 verse six. **E1**

“Blessed and holy is the one who shares in the first resurrection, over such the second death has no power, but they will be priests of God and of the Messiah, and they will reign with him for 1000 years.” Those of us who will be caught up to Heaven (along with those who are in the first resurrection who were found worthy) will be given new heavenly bodies apart from the flesh. We, just like our Messiah, will shed our old fleshly bodies along with the evil nature of the flesh and will take on new heavenly bodies. Upon which time we will rule and reign with our Messiah over the nations for 1000 years.

Up until this point in time there is one group of people left that needs to be identified, and that is the people who are still part of these earthly nations. The nations that we will be ruling and reigning over with our Messiah, will be people who have survived the end of the age, and are still left upon the earth. There will still be people left on the earth who did not come against our Messiah at the end of the age. There will be people left on the earth who through these perilous times, and through these judgments, will have accepted the true Messiah as being Yeshua Hamashiach (Jesus the Messiah) and will have returned from their wicked ways and repented. These fleshly beings will be given 1000 years to live upon the earth, and their generations will also be given the opportunity to choose whom it is that they will serve.

These people still being of earthly and fleshly bodies, will be given the time to choose just as we were given the time to choose who it is that we will serve. And this is why the Dragon (also known as the devil) is let loose at the end of the thousand years to once again tempt the last of the remaining nations, and those who are in the flesh to come against the one true Elohim of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

When our Father proclaimed that he did not want even one to perish, he meant it. And this is all part of our Father in Heaven giving everyone every opportunity possible to come to him before he separates himself from them forever. He does not want even one to perish. Every single solitary opportunity possible is going to be given to every single solitary person to make the right decision. And I want us to understand that during this 1000-year millennial reign, many of these nations will still rebel against the one true Elohim of all creation. And just to get a sneak peek about how things will come about in this 1000-year millennial reign, we can turn to **Zachariah chapter 14 verses 14 through 21 E2**

Zec 14:14 Even Judah will fight at Jerusalem. And the wealth of all the surrounding nations shall be collected, gold, silver, and garments in great abundance.

Zec 14:15 And a plague like this plague shall fall on the horses, the mules, the camels, the donkeys, and whatever beasts may be in those camps.

Zec 14:16 Then everyone who survives of all the nations that have come against Jerusalem shall go up year after year to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, and to keep the Feast of Booths.

Zec 14:17 And if any of the families of the earth do not go up to Jerusalem to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, there will be no rain on them.

Zec 14:18 And if the family of Egypt does not go up and present themselves, then on them there shall be no rain; there shall be the plague with which the LORD afflicts the nations that do not go up to keep the Feast of Booths.

Zec 14:19 This shall be the punishment to Egypt and the punishment to all the nations that do not go up to keep the Feast of Booths.

Zec 14:20 And on that day there shall be inscribed on the bells of the horses, "Holy to the LORD." And the pots in the house of the LORD shall be as the bowls before the altar.

Zec 14:21 And every pot in Jerusalem and Judah shall be holy to the LORD of hosts, so that all who sacrifice may come and take of them and boil the meat of the sacrifice in them. And there shall no longer be a trader in the house of the LORD of hosts on that day.

Notice here in Zachariah chapter 14 verse 16, that everyone who survives of all the nations that have come against Jerusalem shall go up year after year to worship the King, Yahovah who is the one true Elohim of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob just as they were commanded to do clear back in the book of Exodus. And if they don't come to worship him, Zachariah tells us that not only will there be no rain upon those nations, but there will be a plague that Yah will inflict upon those nations who do not keep the feast of Sukkot (also known as the feast of booths, or Tabernacles).

And so even during the millennial reign, there will be people left here on earth and they will be the remnant of the nations of the earth that we (true God-fearing, Messiah following, cross bearing Christians) will rule over with our Messiah. And even in the 1000 year millennial reign, after all of the plagues, and after all of the horsemen, and after all of the trumpets, and after all of the bowls, and even after the war of Armageddon, there will still be these fleshly people who will reject the one true Elohim of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and his only begotten Son that he sent to save them.

This 1000-year millennial reign will be Yah's way of wringing out the last remnants of evil from mankind. Just like we wring out a washcloth to get all of the water out, so too will our

Father in Heaven wring out mankind to remove any remnant of evil. And so, according to Revelation chapter 20, there will be four different people groups upon the earth during the 1000-year millennial reign of our Messiah. (scrn 3)

Four Groups of People In The 1000 Year Millennial Reign

1. The twelve disciples who will rule over the 12 tribes of Israel.
2. Those who were martyred for the testimony of our Messiah and for the word of Yah who had not taken the Mark of the beast who will rule over what's left of the nations.
3. The dead who will remain in the grave during the last 1000 year millennial reign of our Messiah who will not be resurrected until after the thousand year reign is over.
4. Those who are alive and remain on the earth after the battle of Armageddon who will be given the opportunity to choose who it is that they will serve.



One of the questions that often times arises is “*How could the people left upon the earth during the 1000-year millennial reign possibly be deceived into thinking that they could once again make war with the creator of the heavens and the earth?*”

We must remember that the people who are left on the earth that make up the nations will still need to overcome the flesh. They will not have new heavenly bodies; they will still be earthly people living in earthly bodies fighting the earthly flesh just as we had to fight our earthly flesh and overcome it in order to be found worthy. Listen to how the apostle Paul explains our earthly flesh, and the difficulties that he had in overcoming the flesh. We can find this in **Romans chapter 7 versus 12 through 25: E3**

Rom 7:12 So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

Rom 7:13 Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure.

Rom 7:14 For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, sold under sin.

Rom 7:15 For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate.

Rom 7:16 Now if I do what I do not want, I agree with the law, that it is good.

Rom 7:17 So now it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me.

Rom 7:18 For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out.

Rom 7:19 For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing.

Rom 7:20 Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me.

Rom 7:21 So I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand.

Rom 7:22 For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being,

Rom 7:23 but I see in my members another law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members.

Rom 7:24 Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?

Rom 7:25 Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin.

Now, I want us to understand that Paul is not saying that it's okay for us to return like a dog to its vomit, or like a pig to its mire and to continue to sin. Paul is not making the excuse that it's okay for us to sin because of our flesh. This Scripture has been taken out of context in order to falsely, wrongly, and shamefully proclaim that we are all "once saved always saved", and so now, "do as thou wilt is the whole of the law". Nothing could be farther from the truth. Once again, we must keep the whole of Scripture in proper context. What was Paul saying here in Romans chapter 7?

Paul was simply explaining the difference between those who live in the spirit, versus those who live in the flesh. Paul tells us very clearly in Romans chapter 8 verse 13, that if we live according to the flesh we will die, but if we live by the spirit, we will live. Listen to what the apostle Paul says in the very next chapter in **Romans chapter 8 verses one through 17: E4**

Rom 8:1 There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

Rom 8:2 For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death.

Rom 8:3 For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh,

Rom 8:4 in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Rom 8:5 For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit.

Rom 8:6 For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace.

Rom 8:7 For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed, it cannot.

Rom 8:8 Those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

Rom 8:9 You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him.

Rom 8:10 But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness.

Rom 8:11 If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.

Rom 8:12 So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh.

Rom 8:13 For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.

Rom 8:14 For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.

Rom 8:15 For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!"

Rom 8:16 The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,

Rom 8:17 and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

Once again, the apostle Paul is making a distinction between those who live according to the flesh, and those who live according to the spirit. We are clearly commanded not to return like a dog to its vomit, or like a pig to its mire and continue to sin. Listen to what the apostle Peter has to say about someone who returns to their sin. We can find that in **second Peter chapter 2 versus 14 through 22: E5**

2Pe 2:14 They have eyes full of adultery, insatiable for sin. They entice unsteady souls. They have hearts trained in greed. Accursed children!

2Pe 2:15 Forsaking the right way, they have gone astray. They have followed the way of Balaam, the son of Beor, who loved gain from wrongdoing,

2Pe 2:16 but was rebuked for his own transgression; a speechless donkey spoke with human voice and restrained the prophet's madness.

2Pe 2:17 These are waterless springs and mists driven by a storm. For them the gloom of utter darkness has been reserved.

2Pe 2:18 For, speaking loud boasts of folly, they entice by sensual passions of the flesh those who are barely escaping from those who live in error.


2Pe 2:19 They promise them freedom, but they themselves are slaves of corruption. For whatever overcomes a person, to that he is enslaved.

2Pe 2:20 For if, after they have escaped the defilements of the world through the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again entangled in them and overcome, the last state has become worse for them than the first.

2Pe 2:21 For it would have been better for them never to have known the way of righteousness than after knowing it to turn back from the holy commandment delivered to them.

2Pe 2:22 What the true proverb says has happened to them: “The dog returns to its own vomit, and the sow, after washing herself, returns to wallow in the mire.”

You can also read Hebrews chapter 10 verses 26 through 31, Hebrews chapter 10 verses 37 through 39, and Hebrews chapter 6 versus four through in order to get a perspective from three more witnesses that will corroborate exactly what both the apostle Paul, and Peter were trying to tell us about not returning to our sin. And we must remember that the very definition of sin is the transgression of the law according to Scripture. (scrn 4)



My friends, if we get nothing else right about the book of Revelation, if our understanding of this book is completely and utterly flawed, let us not get this most important fact wrong. Let us be strong in the knowledge of knowing that we cannot allow the flesh to lead the spirit. We cannot drink of the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons. We cannot partake of the table of the Lord and the table of demons. “*Once saved always saved*” is nothing but a man-made demonically inspired doctrine that comes straight from the Devils Bible itself. All “*once saved always saved*” truly is... is “*do as thou wilt is now the whole of the law*” which comes right out of the Devils Bible itself. If we do not stand, and if we shrink back, and if we become part of those who live according to the flesh, we will not be able to please Yah. “*For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God’s law; indeed, it cannot. Those*

who are in the flesh cannot please Yah” Romans chapter 8 verses six through eight. Highlight this chapter in your Bible, highlight these verses, read them daily, meditate on them, embed them in your mind and in your heart, and know and understand that if our Father’s laws are not written in your heart and in your mind, then you do not belong to the Messiah that he sent to be the propitiation for our sins. Read Jeremiah chapter 31 verses 31 through 33 in the Old Testament, and Hebrews chapter 10 verses 15 through 17. Read Matthew chapter 5 verses 17 and 18, read the seven letters to the seven assemblies at the beginning of the book of Revelation, and know how important it is for us to be keeping our Fathers commandments. This is the very definition of the love of God according to first John chapter 5 verses two and three, and first John chapter 2 verses four through six. **E1**

Getting back into Revelation chapter 20 verse six, I want us to see that blessed and holy is the one who shares in the first resurrection. Why? Because the one who shares in the first resurrection will not be subject to the second death. The one who shares in the first resurrection will be priests of God and of the Messiah, and they will reign with him for 1000 years. Those who share in the first resurrection will not be tempted at the end of the thousand-year millennial reign when the devil is once again turned loose upon the earth to tempt the nations for the last time. Those who share in the first resurrection will have no part in this temptation. But those living in fleshly bodies because they originally rejected the Messiah, will once again be tempted by the tempter and I want us to understand that according to Revelation chapter 20 verse eight, their number will be like the sand of the sea.

When the thousand-year millennial reign of our Messiah has ended, the devil will be released from his prison, and he will come out once again to deceive the nations that are at the four corners of the earth, and once again these nations are referred to as “*Gog and Magog*”. Why? Because it was Gog and Magog who our Messiah defeated at Armageddon. This last and final battle will be against the remnant of Gog and Magog who will reject him and they will indeed have a number that is like the sand of the sea. None of those who were included in the first resurrection will have anything to do with those counted as Gog and Magog.

And so, I want to be very clear here according to what we are reading here in Revelation chapter 20. The leadership of the millennial kingdom will be populated by a minority of believers who survived the end times judgments and were found worthy, along with the majority of re-embodied souls of believers who died before the second coming.

Those human beings who will be blessed enough to survive the end times on earth, will enter the millennial kingdom as converted believers and hopefully will remain believers until they and their offspring are also found worthy. They will have to make the same conscious decision to love and to trust the Messiah as we had to. And clearly... once again, most of them will not. Most of them will be included in that final battle as Gog and Magog to come against the one true Elohim of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

There will be births and children born during the millennial reign, and there will be deaths,

and people will die during the millennial reign. And this is exactly why Paul tells us in first Corinthians chapter 15 verse 26, that the last enemy to be destroyed is death itself. And with that being said I'd like us to turn back and just reread through **Revelation chapter 20 verses seven through 10: E1**

Rev 20:7 And when the thousand years are ended, Satan will be released from his prison

Rev 20:8 and will come out to deceive the nations that are at the four corners of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them for battle; their number is like the sand of the sea.

Rev 20:9 And they marched up over the broad plain of the earth and surrounded the camp of the saints and the beloved city, but fire came down from heaven and consumed them,

Rev 20:10 and the devil who had deceived them was thrown into the lake of fire and sulfur where the beast and the false prophet were, and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever.

What is striking to understand here is that the devil will once again be able to deceive an uncountable Army of human beings and lead them to slaughter. How can that possibly be? After all our Messiah will have done, how could anyone be so deceived as to once again doubt the power of the one true Elohim of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob? Well, let's think about that for just a moment.

Why is it that after 2000 years, many of us who are true God-fearing, Messiah following, cross bearing Christians are just now coming back to the Torah, and the commandments and the precepts and the appointments and the sabbaths of our Father in Heaven? Why is it that after 2000 years, we are just now fighting our way back to the truth?

The very reason that after 2000 years we are finally waking up and returning to the truth of Scripture, is because mankind never learns from his history. Mankind never learns how he has fallen in the past, he never learns from the empires that have come before him, he never learns how each and every Empire before him has fallen. Man, continuously bangs his head against the same wall over, and over, and over again. Those who do not understand their history, are bound to repeat it. And this is exactly why the devil works so hard to cover up, and to distort, and to deceive the actual facts of mankind's history.

The devil is banking on the fact that mankind won't learn from his mistakes, and that mankind will continue to make these mistakes generation, after generation, after generation. Even today in our time, our society looks at the elderly as washed up forgotten has-beens and nothing more. The wealth of information that elderly people have, and the wisdom that they have amassed because they are elderly... is now laughed at, and mocked, and seen as feeble, and of no value. Today's youth are more stiff-necked than they have ever been in history.

Today's youth wants more and more of the world and less and less of their creator, and just exactly what has been written in second Timothy chapter 3 has happened to them. **Second Timothy chapter 3 versus one through nine: E6**

2Ti 3:1 *But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty.*

2Ti 3:2 *For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy,*

2Ti 3:3 *heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good,*

2Ti 3:4 *treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God,*

2Ti 3:5 *having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people.*

2Ti 3:6 *For among them are those who creep into households and capture weak women, burdened with sins and led astray by various passions,*

2Ti 3:7 *always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth.*

2Ti 3:8 *Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so these men also oppose the truth, men corrupted in mind and disqualified regarding the faith.*

2Ti 3:9 *But they will not get very far, for their folly will be plain to all, as was that of those two men.*

This my friends is the war that the apostle Paul was talking about in Ephesians chapter 6 when he told us that we do not wrestle against flesh and blood but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in heavenly places. This is... that war.

We see it in our governments, in our houses of legislations, we see it in the executive branch, we see it in the legislative branch, we see it in the judicial branches, our leaders have become lovers of themselves, lovers of money, they have become proud and arrogant and abusive and disobedient. They have become ungrateful, unholy, heartless and unappeasable, slanderous, they are without self-control, and they are brutal to one another because they do not love what is good. They have become treacherous, reckless and swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God. Being made in the image of God, they have an appearance of godliness, but they deny its power. And within the leadership of our countries around the world, we now see a battle going on between the young versus the old.

Young people today have no respect for their elders, they count them as deadweight, and because we have not raised our children with the respect that our Father in Heaven demands, we have spoiled the child because we have spared the rod... and they are now off the hook, and have gone off the rails, and become monsters who want nothing more than free stuff that they did not earn, respect that they did not earn, power that they did not earn, they have become

nothing more than shepherds feeding themselves, waterless clouds swept along by the wind, fruitless trees in late autumn and these... are the world's leaders to come.

And so, it should not be surprising to us that after this one-thousand-year millennial reign, the devil will be so easily able to gather so many to come against our Messiah who will be our King at that time. But at that time... we must also know and understand that in Revelation chapter 20 verse nine, our Father in Heaven does indeed put the enemies of his Son under his sons' feet.

According to Revelation chapter 20 verse nine, at the end of the 1000-year millennial reign the devil along with the Gog's and Magog's of the earth will march up over the broad plain of the earth and surrounded the camp of the Saints and the beloved city. And my friends I want you to know, and I want you to understand that that beloved city is indeed going to be the city of Jerusalem. From the very beginning of time when our Father in Heaven put his name there in Jerusalem the devil has wanted nothing more than to sit in the temple of Yah and claim himself to be Yah. And after the millennial reign, the devil will once again make a last stand to sit on the throne of Yah, and fire will come down from Heaven and consume every single, solitary last grain of sand that they number. Every single, solitary soul who sides with the Dragon will be annihilated, not by a human army, not by an army of angels, but by the very hand of Yah himself.

And according to Revelation chapter 20 verse 10, the devil who had deceived them was thrown into the Lake of fire and sulfur and the beast, and the false prophet will join him in that Lake of fire and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever according to Revelation chapter 20 verse 10.

In Revelation chapter 20 verse 11 we're told that John then saw a great white throne and him who was seated on it, and John says that the earth and the sky fled away and no place was found for them. And it was at that point in time that John saw the dead both great and small standing before the throne and the books were opened. Those books would indeed be the 66 books that we call our Bible today that Yah made sure that we would have here on earth. And then John tells us that another book would be opened which would be the book of life. And the dead were judged by what was written in the books according to what they had done.

Now at this point in time, I'm sure that many people will have died during the 1000-year millennial kingdom who had indeed turned, and come back to the Messiah. And so, I am not convinced that everyone in the second resurrection will be condemned. We're told in Revelation chapter 20 verse 12, that these dead were judged by what was written in the books and according to what they had done. And Revelation chapter 20 verse 13 goes on to tell us that the sea gave up the dead who were in it, death and Hades gave up the dead who were in it, and they were judged each one of them according to what they had done.

And so, because we know that the nations did indeed continue on during the 1000 year millennial reign, and we know that people will go on living and having children, and living out

their lives, and dying like normal men, there is no doubt in my mind that some of these that have died during the 1000 year millennial reign will indeed be found worthy after being judged according to what they had done.

At this point in time, death and Hades will be thrown into the Lake of fire which is the second death, and if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he also was thrown into the Lake of fire. Which brings us to Revelation chapter 21 when we see a new Heaven, and a new earth because the first Heaven and the first earth had passed away. At that point in time we will see a new Jerusalem coming down out of Heaven from Yahovah prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And we'll take a closer look at Revelation chapter 21 next seventh day Sabbath at 11 AM Eastern standard time.

As for now, we will close the books, and I will once again ask that everyone within the sound of my voice would please take what you have heard here today to your own prayer closet. Bow your head, and bend your knee, and face the holy promise land of Jerusalem, and ask in the name of Yeshua Hamashiach if what you have heard here today be true, or not.

Ask, seek, and knock and the door will be opened to you. And if you will do that, and if you will stay the course to the end, you and I will surely walk through the Gates of his soon coming kingdom together.
