

Mark Chapter 1c Yeshua A Man Among Men

Once again before we get started here this morning, I would just like to say welcome to everyone and thank you so very much for joining us for our Father's seventh day Sabbath study here today that has everything to do with the only begotten Son of God who was indeed a man among men.

Last week we spoke about the importance of the baptism of our Messiah as a man and exactly why it was that our Father in heaven looked down upon him and said and I quote, "You are my beloved Son with you I am well pleased."


Once again, as we have already seen last week, we're going to see again the importance of the obedience of Yeshua (Jesus in the Greek) being a human man according to our God breathed Scripture.

Today's modern day denominational churches often times teach many things concerning the Jesus of the church that has absolutely nothing to do with the Hebrew Yeshua, Son of David Son of Abraham who became the Son of Yehovah God because of his obedience to Yehovah God. And here today were going to see a striking difference between what the denominational churches of today are teaching and preaching versus what the truth of the Bible actually tells us about not only the identity of our Messiah... but also what it was that he came to teach and preach. Just last night we aired a brand-new study concerning the antichrist where we spoke in some detail about the antichrist to come being a lawless man according to Scripture. And although the church today knows that the antichrist will indeed be a lawless man, they continuously teach God's people to be and I quote, "lawless" which is literally setting the church up to accept the lawless antichrist to come.

The very thing that we are not supposed to be, is exactly what they are teaching and preaching. The very thing that the Bible tells us to stay away from, they have literally embraced.

And therefore, as we journey through these God breathed Scriptures and the historical accounts of the life of our Messiah who is the anointed one of Yehovah God our Father in heaven... it's important that we understand that we are commanded to pick up our crosses and to follow him not the church.

Nowhere within the confines of the 66 books of our Bibles are we commanded to follow the majority or to follow a denominational empire of men, or even a rabbi or a Pope. In fact... our Messiah commands us to follow none of these things. Matthew chapter 23 verses eight through 11 (scrn 1)



According to our Messiah we are not to be called rabbi because Rabbi means "great one" and no one is great but our Father in heaven. And according to our Messiah we are to call no man on earth our spiritual father for we have one spiritual Father who is in heaven and yes that includes your Catholic priests who love to be called "father" and who have absolutely no power to forgive sin at all whatsoever according to our God breathed Scripture. And our Messiah goes on to tell us to call no man our masters because we have one master and that is the Messiah. And therefore, the greatest among us is supposed to be a servant just like our Messiah was a servant who washed the very feet of his very own apostles.

And therefore, the very idea of following after a denominational empire or a man-made church has no biblical foundation within the confines of our God breathed Scripture. And yet... people do it all the day long... day in and day out year after year and generation after generation never understanding that to follow the church today is often times to forsake the one true only begotten Son of God. It's important that we understand the obedience that our Messiah who was the only begotten Son of God demonstrated to us so that we would also be obedient to his Father in heaven just like he was. But the problem that we have today is that today's denominational church teaches the exact opposite of obedience. The denominational church today teaches the exact opposite of being lawful all the while teaching lawlessness which leads to depravity and self-righteousness and vanity.

The very idea that Jesus did it all for me at the cross once again establishes the devils do as thou wilt is the whole of the law doctrine. Jesus did it all for me at the cross establishes a life of vanity filled beliefs and doxologies. The problem with these doxologies is that none of them include the name of Yehovah God which establishes which god they're talking about. Saying that you love God is like looking at your wife and saying "honey I love humanity". "I love humanity" is not what your wife wants to hear. Your wife wants to hear you say that you love her and her alone. Just like there are many people within humanity so too are there many gods found within the pages of our Bibles. And if you're not using the name of the one true God, then how does anyone know which god your worshiping? Even our United States dollar bills state on them and I quote, "in God we trust" but there is no mention of which god it is that we trust because once again they refuse to use his name. And this is all too convenient when we speak about a vague god that we worship or have trust in.

We must remember that according to our God breathed Scripture there are many gods mentioned within the confines of the 66 books of the Bible, but there is only one true Most High God who has a name that is very rarely if ever used by today's denominational apostate church. Today's denominational apostate church has no idea that there Father in heaven the one true God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob wrote his name in their Bibles over 6519 times. Which once again leads not to obedience... but to disobedience because it is clearly written that "thou shall have no other gods before me". And if we are worshiping someone or something else other than Yehovah the one true Elohim of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, then we are literally forsaking Yeshua who the church today calls by the Greek name "Jesus". If we add to God's word and take away from God's word then God's word is no longer God's word it becomes our word because we have sinfully created for ourselves our own man-made doctrines. (scrn 2) show only:

2Sa 7:13 He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever.

2Sa 7:14 I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son When he commits iniquity, I will discipline him with the rod of men, with the stripes of the sons of men,

2Sa 7:15 but my steadfast love will not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I put away from before you.

2Sa 7:16 And your house (David) and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever.'"

And I don't want to get too far off topic here this morning, but I do want to make it evidently clear that our Messiah who was the only begotten Son of God according to second Samuel chapter 7 verse 14... was begotten buy Yehovah God for a reason.

There was a reason that during our Messiah's baptism our Father looked down upon him and said, "You are my beloved Son with you I am well pleased". The very reason that Yehovah God said that he was well pleased with his Son is because of the obedience of his Son. And to better understand the obedience that our Messiah had concerning his Father in heaven, I would like for us to jump ahead in the book of Mark to **Matthew chapter 26 verses 36 through 46 E1**

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Jesus Prays in Gethsemane

Mat 26:36 Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray."

Mat 26:37 And taking with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he began to be sorrowful and troubled.

Mat 26:38 Then he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me."

Mat 26:39 And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will."

Mat 26:40 And he came to the disciples and found them sleeping. And he said to Peter, "So, could you not watch with me one hour?

Mat 26:41 Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

Mat 26:42 Again, for the second time, he went away and prayed, "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, your will be done."

Mat 26:43 And again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy.

Mat 26:44 So, leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words again.

Mat 26:45 Then he came to the disciples and said to them, "Sleep and take your rest later on. See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners.

Mat 26:46 Rise, let us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand."

Right here according to Mathew chapter 26 verses 36 through 46 we can clearly see that it was not our messiahs will to be nailed to a cross and crucified. It was not our messiahs will to be flogged and beaten and spit upon and publicly humiliated. Our Messiah clearly asks his Father three different times to take this cup from him because it was not what he himself wanted.

But you see, it was indeed the will of his Father. It was the will of our Father in heaven to crush him and to put him to grief so that... out of the anguish of his soul our Messiah would be able to see and be satisfied. It was the will of Yehovah God to crush him and to put him to grief and to bear the iniquities of all of mankind so that Yehovah God could divide him a portion with the many and divide the spoil with the strong.

You see, it was because our Messiah was obedient to his Father even unto death... that he was able to bear the sins of many and to make intercession for the transgressors who are you and I. Not says I, but says our God breathed Scripture in Isaiah chapter 53 verses 10 through 12 (scrn 3)

Isa 53:10 Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for guilt, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.

Isa 53:11 Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied ; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities .

Isa 53:12 Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors ; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

Once again, the truth that we find within the confines of our God breathed Scripture is a much different truth than the man-made truth of today's denominational church. And there's a reason for that.

The devil has always been about adding to God's word and taking away from God's word in order to create a different gospel. The devil has always been about mixing and mingling the truth of God's word with lies and deception in order to fool, if possible, even the very elect.

But the point that I'm trying to stress here this morning is that the very reason that our Messiah was able to bear the sins of many and to make intercession for us as transgressors was because he poured out his soul to

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death and was numbered with the transgressors according to... the very will of his Father in heaven. And the bottom line is that our Messiah did what he did in obedience to his Father in heaven. He did not do what he wanted to do, but rather through obedience... he did what was required of him to do, and if was for this very reason that we have a Messiah, and a King this very day. And that obedience to God even unto death is and obedience that he taught to those who would also pick up their crosses and follow him even down into the grave itself. And this is what being a true God fearing Messiah following cross bearing Christian is all about.

It's not all about how special we are. It's about how special he is. It's not about me, myself, and I. It's about the assembly, the community, it's about the kingdom, and the well being of the body as a whole and until we come to that realization we will never truly be... Christians.

Our Messiah did what was right for the body, the assembly, the kingdom of believers to come. He put himself in behind his brothers and sisters as a servant in order that like a good shepherd... he could see the whole flock and could protect us with the rod and the staff that he was given.

Once again, the Yeshua who is the only begotten Son of Yehovah God of the Bible is the exact opposite of the Jesus that the church today is portraying. The Jesus of the denominational church today is a lawless son who came to do away with the law of his Father and to make it all about himself by celebrating his own birthday and robbing the Sabbath from his Father and teaching people to follow after the commandments of men rather than the commandments of Yehovah God but you see that's not at all what the true Son of God came to accomplish.

The Jesus of the church today is a far cry from the true biblical Yeshua who was a Hebrew Jew who came from the very body of David and the tribe of Judah. And I know that there are an abundance of wolves in sheep's clothing out there that would love to tear me to pieces for saying such a thing, but I will continue to shout these things from the rooftops because you see I am a Christian. I am... a son of God. And my

allegiance is not to these wolves in sheep's clothing. My allegiance is to my Father in heaven and the only begotten Son that he sent to be the King that I serve. And I will in no way belittle the work that he has unselfishly done on my behalf... and nor should you.

We also need to position ourselves behind the flock that we also may protect the flock with the rod and the staff of truth that we also have been given for it is written that in the last days we will rule and reign with him for a thousand years and that we will be a holy nation of priests before him. But you see... this will never happen unless we go down into that watery grave of baptism and are raised up new creatures. A creature of faith, a creature of obedience, a creature that understands the truth biblical definition of the love of God found in 1st John chapter 5 verse 3, for I tell you the truth... it will only be these new creatures that will gain entrance into his coming kingdom.

You see, the very reason that I can say these things is because I do not serve them. I have nothing to do with them. They are not part of me and I am not part of them and I have willfully and intentionally chosen not to be yoked together with them. I do not run to them for advice. I do not bow the knee to their man-made wisdom. I do not read their books or purchase their snake oil, and I do not further their authority by putting myself under their direction. They have willfully and intentionally chosen to be disobedient, while I have chosen to be obedient. They have chosen to be lawless while I have chosen to be lawful. They have chosen the festivals and the feast days and the sabbaths of the Roman Catholic Church, while I have chosen the festivals and the feast days and the Sabbaths of the one true Elohim of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and my King who now sits on the throne of David at the right hand of my Father in heaven.

You see, there is a difference between us and them. There is a difference between the true believer who believes the truth, and who verifies the truth through our God breathed Scripture and those who serve Roman Catholicism and its first day of the week Sunday Sabbath, and its Good Friday, and its pagan Easter, and its Christ-mass and it's Halloween.

You see there is a difference between obedience and disobedience. There is a difference between the clean and the unclean. There is a difference between righteousness according to the law of Yehovah God and unrighteousness which is once again... lawlessness. There is a difference between the love of God and the love of man. And just as we have already made plain in our study concerning the antichrist... the antichrist to come will indeed be lawless according to our God breathed Scripture. And if this be true... and we know that it is according to Scripture... then why in God's name would anyone of us choose to be... lawless?

I tell you the truth... the world will be all too ready to follow after this lawless antichrist and so too will the church because the devil has primed both the world and the church to be... lawless. And therefore to follow after a lawless man will seem natural to them. The devil has primed both the world and the church today to believe that "do as thou wilt is the whole of the law".

Keeping all of these things in mind, I would like for us now to turn to the book of Mark and I would like for us to continue reading down through Mark chapter 1 verses 14 through 45. And as we read down through Mark chapter 1 I want us to take note of the fact that it was after our messiahs baptism that our Messiah begins to call his first disciples. It is after his baptism that he begins to heal people with unclean spirits and to cast out demons. It is after his baptism that he begins to heal many and to preach in Galilee and to cleanse lepers. But once again, the only reason that he was able to do these miracles and to chase off demons was because of his obedience to his Father in heaven which led his Father to be... well pleased with him.

Keeping all of these things in mind, let's now read Mark chapter 1 verses 14 through 45 and let's see what happens after... And again I emphasize after... Our Messiah is baptized. **Mark chapter 1 verses 14 through 45 E2**

Jesus Begins His Ministry

Mar 1:14 Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God,

Mar 1:15 and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel."

Jesus Calls the First Disciples

Mar 1:16 Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen.

Mar 1:17 And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men."

Mar 1:18 And immediately they left their nets and followed him.

Mar 1:19 And going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets.

Mar 1:20 And immediately he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed him.

Jesus Heals a Man with an Unclean Spirit

Mar 1:21 And they went into Capernaum, and immediately on the Sabbath he entered the synagogue and was teaching.

Mar 1:22 And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes.

Mar 1:23 And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit. And he cried out,

Mar 1:24 "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God."

Mar 1:25 But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!"

Mar 1:26 And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying out with a loud voice, came out of him.

Mar 1:27 And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him."

Mar 1:28 And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee.

Jesus Heals Many

Mar 1:29 And immediately he left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John.

Mar 1:30 Now Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, and immediately

they told him about her.

Mar 1:31 And he came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

Mar 1:32 That evening at sundown they brought to him all who were sick or oppressed by demons.

Mar 1:33 And the whole city was gathered together at the door.

Mar 1:34 And he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

Jesus Preaches in Galilee

Mar 1:35 And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed.

Mar 1:36 And Simon and those who were with him searched for him,

Mar 1:37 and they found him and said to him, "Everyone is looking for you."

Mar 1:38 And he said to them, "Let us go on to the next towns, that I may preach there also, for that is why I came out."

Mar 1:39 And he went throughout all Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out demons.

Jesus Cleanses a Leper

Mar 1:40 And a leper came to him, imploring him, and kneeling said to him, "If you will, you can make me clean."

Mar 1:41 Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand and touched him and said to him, "I will; be clean."

Mar 1:42 And immediately the leprosy left him, and he was made clean.

Mar 1:43 And Jesus sternly charged him and sent him away at once,

Mar 1:44 and said to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone, but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses commanded, for a proof to them."

Mar 1:45 But he went out and began to talk freely about it, and to spread the news, so that Jesus could no longer openly enter a town, but was out in desolate places, and people were coming to him from every quarter.

The very first thing that we see here in Mark chapter 1 verse 14 is that John the Baptist was arrested and Yeshua came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God. And I want to stop right here for just a moment so that we can understand where this gospel message was established and where this gospel message came from in the first place. Once again, what is the gospel message? Is the gospel message found in the New Testament or is the gospel message found in the Old Testament? Because I would submit to you my friends that the gospel message that our Messiah came to teach and preach is found first in the Old Testament not in the new. And yes, the gospel message is indeed found in the New Testament but it's not found their first, it is found their last.

The gospel message of Yehovah God begins in Genesis chapter 1 verse one and this is exactly what our Messiah came proclaiming according to the disciple Mark. And exactly what was it that our Messiah said? According to Mark our Messiah said that the time is fulfilled and the kingdom of God is at hand and therefore it's time to repent and believe in and returned to... the gospel of God.

And once again my friends I would like for us to stop and think about what Mark is telling us here. Mark is not telling us that Jesus came to preach to us a new gospel message. This gospel message that Yeshua came to preach was anything but new. This gospel message that Yeshua came to teach and to preach was taught clear back in the book of Genesis and it wasn't his gospel, it was his Father's gospel. And it was because our Messiah was obedient to the gospel of God the Father... that he was able to bear the sins of many and to make intercession for us as transgressors. It was because our Messiah was obedient to the gospel of God his Father that he was able to begin his ministry, that he was able to then call his first disciples, that he was able to heal man with unclean spirits and to cast out demons, that he was able to heal the sick and to cleanse lepers. All of these gifts were given to our Messiah because of his obedience. And once again not says I, but says our God breathed Scripture.

If we remember nothing else, we should always put first and foremost in our minds the fact that our Messiah came to be our example. I would like for us to turn in Matthew chapter 10 versus 34 through 39 E3:

Not Peace, but a Sword

Mat 10:34 "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword.
Mat 10:35 For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law.
Mat 10:36 And a person's enemies will be those of his own household.
Mat 10:37 Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me.
Mat 10:38 And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me.
Mat 10:39 Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for


my sake will find it.

According to our Messiah he did not come to bring peace to the earth. And that may shocking to many modern-day Christians today who don't read the Bible for themselves, but the fact is that our Messiah did not come to bring peace but to bring a sword. In other words, he came to bring a fight. He came to make war against the wicked and against the ungodly.

And our Messiah goes on to tell us very clearly that he came to set a man against his father and the daughter against her mother and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law and that a person's enemies would be those of his own household.

And from there he goes on even further and he says whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me, but there's more!

Our Messiah even goes so far as to say that he who does not pick up his cross and follow him is not worthy of him. In other words, our Messiah came to be our example. And if we are not following his example, then we are not following him. It does no one any good to pick up their cross and follow the church or to follow a denominational empire of men or to follow a rabbi or to follow up Pope. To follow after these things is to follow after the devil! Matthew chapter 15 verses seven through nine (scrn 4)



Even during the days of our Messiah when he was here on this earth walking among us people were honoring him with their lips while their harts were far from him. People were worshiping him in vain. And why were they worshiping him in vain? Because they were teaching as doctrines the commandments of men which were no doctrines at all. And I tell you the truth my friends there is no difference between the days of our Messiah and the days that we are now living in today in fact, I would contend that the hypocrisy of the church today has grown a thousandfold and the abominations that has been drug into the church today are exactly why today's denominational churches just like the first two temples of Yehovah God... will indeed be brought to desolation along with those who teach such abominations.

As we have said before, so now we see again, this is no game that we play. It's not about what you believe or what I believe. It's about the truth versus deception. It's about good versus evil. It's about the true

love of God versus the false love of man. It's about Yehovah God's righteousness versus man's righteousness. It's about obedience which boils down to obedience. What are you being obedient to? Who are you being obedient to?

My friends our Messiah was a man among men. He took no bull. He spoke the truth even when he knew full well that they were going to kill him for speaking that truth. Our Messiah came to preach the gospel of God not his own gospel. Our Messiah came to reinforce our Father in heaven's seventh day Sabbath that points back to creation and is a sign between us and him not to steal it for himself. Our Messiah came to turn us back to his Father in heaven not to celebrate his own birthday. Our Messiah came to wash the feet of his apostles, not to be served... but to serve so that by his example we would all learn to serve one another.

But you see my friends this is not what the devil's church teaches today in our time. The devil's church today is all about a Roman Catholic created first day of the week Sunday Sabbath created by the Pope of Rome which honors the Pope of Rome who created it.

The church today teaches a lawless doctrine of men who have twisted the writings of the apostle Paul just exactly as Peter warned us that they would in **second Peter chapter 3 verses 15 through 17 (scrn 5)** **2Pe 3:15** And count the patience of our Lord as salvation, just as our beloved brother Paul also wrote to you according to the wisdom given him,

2Pe 3:16 as he does in all his letters when he speaks in them of these matters. There are some things in them that are hard to understand, which the ignorant and unstable twist to their own destruction, as they do the other Scriptures.

2Pe 3:17 You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, take care that you are not carried away with the error of lawless people and lose your own stability.

Right here in second Peter chapter 3 the apostle Peter warns us against lawless people who would twist the writings of the apostle Paul to their own destruction as they do the other scriptures. And the apostle Peter warns us in second Peter chapter 3 verse 17 that because he has warned us about these things that we should not be carried away with the error of lawless people. But the question is... are we listening to the apostle Peter? Are we preventing ourselves to be carried away with the error of lawless people... or... is this exactly what we are doing?

I ask you plainly, are you allowing lawless people to lead you astray? Are you allowing lawless people to lead you and your children and your children's children down into the pit of hell because you have willfully and intentionally chosen to disregard the spoken word of Yehovah God and to trade it for the wisdom of men? Are you honoring him with your lips while your heart is far from him because you are teaching the doctrines of man and not the doctrines of Yehovah God?

Do you understand the significance of Numbers chapter 15 verses 38 through 41? Do you even know what Numbers chapter 15 verses 38

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through 41 says? Have you ever even read the book of Numbers for yourself? Do you know what you've been grafted into? Do you know that according to James in Acts chapter 21 verse 24 that the apostle Paul always lived in observance of the law? Do you know that the Gentiles were being grafted into the house of Israel clear back in the book of Exodus in the beginning of the Bible? Do know that the Gentiles were always commanded to be circumcised according to your God breathed Scripture? Do you know what picking up your Cross and following your Jewish Messiah is all about? Do you even know that your Messiah, your king, was a Hebrew man who came from the very body of David his human father according to second Samuel chapter 7? Do you know what Old Testament Scriptures verify and qualify Yeshua to be the only begotten Son of God? Or are you still running around calling your Messiah by a Greek name that no one had ever even heard of until the seventeenth century?

What rock do you stand on? What ground have you built your house upon? What foundation substantiates your faith? Can you justify what you believe according to Scripture and Scripture alone?

Or are you just another wandering generality, being led around by the nose with hooks in your jaws thinking all the while that you are serving... Jesus? Matthew chapter 7 verses 21 through 23 (scrn 6)

I Do Not Know Those Who Are Lawless!

Mat 7:21 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven.

Mat 7:22 On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?'

Mat 7:23 And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'

Lawless = Iniquity G458 = illegality, that is, violation of law



Once again my friends we've been saying it for the last 12 years, these are the most frightening Scriptures that you will find anywhere within the confines of the 66 books of your Bible.

To think that you know your Messiah only to find out that you do not know your Messiah and that he doesn't know you because you are lawless is indeed the most frightening of all Scripture.

But I tell you the truth, our Messiah is no liar and these things will come to pass. There will be people who will think that they have prophesied in his name, and who will think that they have cast out demons in his name, and who will think that they have done all kinds of mighty works in his name that will soon find out that he never even knew them because... they were lawless.

Once again my friends he who is lawless is antichrist.


A disobedient Jesus could not have defeated Satan in the desert. A disobedient Jesus could not have cast out demons. A disobedient Jesus

could have healed no one. A disobedient Jesus could not have cleansed the lepers or given sight to the blind or taught... the gospel of God.


Make no mistake about it my friends our Messiah was obedient to the core. He was indeed a man among men who came to lead all men back to his Father in heaven and away from the prince of the air and the little "g" god of this world.

Our Messiah did things that he didn't want to do in order that we also would do things that we don't want to do.

If we are living in the flesh, we are not going to be able to submit to God's law, not says I, but says the apostle Paul in **Romans chapter 8** verses seven through nine (scrn 7)



Right here according to the apostle Paul in Romans chapter 8 the apostle Paul tells us that the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God because it does not submit to God's law because it can't. My friends, you simply cannot get any more plain than that. And because the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God and because it does not submit to God's law because it can't... those who have a mind that is set on the flesh cannot please God according to... the apostle Paul right here in Romans chapter 8. (scrn 8) show only



The biblical definition of sin is the transgression of the law according to first John chapter 3 verse four. Sin is the transgression of the law. The only thing that our Messiah nailed to the cross was the penalty of the law because he paid that penalty for us provided... provided... that we pick up our crosses and follow him and do not return like a dog to its vomit and like a pig to its mire.

If you still think the Jesus of the church is going to save you, you better think again because just as our Messiah tells us, if you are lawless... he doesn't even know you.

But rather, let us turn back to our Father in heaven as our Messiah has taught us to do. Let us allow him to lead and let us allow him to set the example, and let us pray that we have the eyes to see and the ears to hear how to follow his example and his example alone.

Let us turn back once again to solo Scripturea... Scripture only.

And with that being said, I will once again ask everyone within the sound of my voice to please take what you have heard here this morning to your own prayer closet. You bow your head, and bend your knee, and face the holy promised land of Jerusalem, and ask in the name of Yeshua Hamashiach if what you have heard here this morning be true or not.

Ask, seek, and knock on his door and on his door alone so that the proper door can be opened unto you. And if you will do that, and if you will stay the course to the end, you and I will surely walk to the gates of his soon coming kingdom together.
